

Frequently Asked Questions at the MEETING OF CREDITORS

Acceptable forms of picture identification (ID) include: driver's license, U.S. government ID, state ID, passport (and current U.S. visa, if not a U.S. citizen), military ID, resident alien card and identity card issued by a national government authority.

Acceptable forms of proof of ALL 9 DIGITS of your Social Security number include: social security card, IRS Form W-2, IRS Form 1099; letter from the IRS and Social Security Administration (SSA) Statement.

1. State your full name.
2. Current Address.
3. Daytime telephone number including area code.
4. Did you live in Arizona for the greater part of six months prior to filing for bankruptcy?
5. Previous bankruptcy cases:
 - a. Have you filed any other bankruptcy case in the past eight years? When? Where? Chapter? End result (dismissal or discharge)?
 - b. Have you filed any bankruptcy case using a different Social Security number than the one you have now?
6. Accuracy
 - a. Did you assist in the preparation of the petition, statements and schedules?
 - b. Did you review the petition, statements and schedules before they were filed with the Court?
 - c. Did you sign the petition, statements and schedules?
 - d. Is the information contained in the petition, schedules, statements and related documents true and accurate to the best of your knowledge?
 - e. Are there any errors or omissions in your documents on file with the Court to bring to the Trustee's or the Court's attention?
 - f. Are all of your assets identified on the schedules?
 - g. Have you listed all of your creditors on the schedules?
7. Did you read and understand the bankruptcy information sheet that the trustee sent you in the mail?
8. Do you have any personal injury or other claims upon which a future lawsuit could be based?
9. Have you been self-employed in the past five years?
10. Have you transferred or sold any property in the past year?
11. Have you waived or disclaimed any right to an inheritance in the past four (4) years?
12. Are you expecting an inheritance in the next six (6) months?
